COVID -19 CONCERNS:

As we continue in these times with tight border controls to keep us all safe from the risk of a resurgence of the virus. Many parishioners are still in a delicate and concerned state about our Masses.

I wish to endeavour to allay some concerns. Firstly, we are still continuing to do a sanitizing mist of the whole church complex prior to the weekend Masses. Also, there is no obligation to receive the chalice if you do not want to. Chalices are only being lightly filled to try to ensure that the Extraordinary Ministers of Communion do not have to consume any left-over Blood of Christ.

A number of parishioners have expressed a concern at receiving the Body of Christ immediately after someone has received on the tongue. To reduce your concerns, I am making a change to relieve these concerns.

If you want to receive Communion on the tongue please do not come forward until the end of distribution, and then come only to me to receive on the tongue. If I am needed to continue distributing Communion after that I will sanitize my hands before distributing again.

You are all encouraged to continue sanitizing your hands also, while the virus is not currently active in the community this could still change rapidly, and it is wise that we sanitize and hand wash correctly.

IF YOU ARE UNWELL, have a cough or cold please do not come to church. You will be politely asked to leave if you attend. This is part of the current nationwide Covid 19 precautions. We appreciate your co-operation and care for the welfare of your fellow parishioners.

SIGN OF PEACE: Only give handshake if you feel comfortable doing so and respect that many do not wish to shake hands. And please, no hugs. The "Covid Bow" is both effective and also very spiritual.
