

St.Thomas More and are in tertiary education now.


Always generous in the service of others Clare has

resources matters.






Father Stuart Young, our parish priest, is a very experienced board member, having chaired the St.Joseph's School, Morrinsville, Board of trustees for fifteen years.

New Zealand stopped on March 25th as a total lockdown descended on us all, the first response to our battle to stop Covid-19 in its tracks.

While we're waiting for public worship to be re-established we can look back at the way people responded. Members of our parish gathered together in the sunshine to pray while Father Stuart celebrated Mass in the parish lounge. As the teachers started their day during Alert 3 we could hear contemplative music and the rosary being prayed in the area dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, graced by the shade of our old tree.

Everyone kept to their two metre social distancing and continued to chat together, ensuring that all important relationships endured through the strange times.

Father Stuart started processing barcodes and congregation numbers as soon as we moved into Alert 3. The biggest difficulty was communicating what needed to happen next. The church app is used by about 280 parishioners. Apart from a telephone tree which was set up by the morning regulars it was very difficult to pass information to parishioners about the importance of nominating a Mass time so the bar codes could be allocated. The expectation that 99 people attending Mass in level 2 would be the norm will be realised this weekend. For many of our parishioners 8 weeks without the blessed sacrament has just been too long.

Distance learning ... Bubble School @ St.Thomas More.

Lockdown for St.Thomas More School students and teachers came with a day's warning leaving us scrambling to put together resources which would support learning for a short time. The unknowns included whether our chromebooks/laptops would be insured if we released them to school families. Teachers were pulled in all directions organising their own families and their households as well as setting up to support our school families. Once the insurance company came back with the okay to send home chromebooks we put together a package for every family in two days- then the real on-line learning began.

Our Bubble School started with morning prayer led by Andrew Chinn (Aussie musician and educator). We really appreciated the time and thought that Andrew put into each day. He needed to rise early and put a prayer reflection and a song clip together in time for the New Zealand and Australian Catholic schools who had tuned into youtube to hear. Every morning at 7.00 a.m. we downloaded morning prayer to our school facebook page and then we were ready to face the day. Thank you to people like Andrew Chinn and Bishop Steve who brought us comfort over the internet in our Covid-19 reality.



The arrival of the Holy Spirit....

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. Celebrated 50 days after Easter, Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. This was the start of their Ministry to go forth and make disciples of all nations. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, our domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both.

Many people miss the opportunity to leave State highway 1 and enjoy the road less travelled. Along the banks of Lake Taupo, to the turn off at Tokaanu, past the road to the Chateau, behind the imposing snowy cones of Tongariro, Ngaruahoe and Ruapehu to the turn off at Raetihi. It's a great adventure into a part of New Zealand where the roads seem empty and the scenery is raw. The road which takes you along the Whanganui River is long

and windy. Cyclists and farmers use this road and while it is sealed there are many blind corners so caution is needed.


After an hour and a half along the Whanganui River road you come to a small sign which says Convent, go over the cattle stop and up a steep driveway you'll reach your destination. And what a view.



The Convent is open to day trippers and overnight guests- just book in via www.compassion.org.nz In March a group of fifteen Catholic principals enjoyed four days of fellowship and prayer focussed on the mission of Suzanne Aubert and her companions.

The two storied Convent was an orphanage and a school as well as being the home of a small group of nuns in the 1890s. Suzanne Aubert would ride down to the wharf to meet the paddle steamer from Auckland which would sometimes bring foundlings who needed love and care. Suzanne had studied medicinal plants and remedies in France before coming to New Zealand. Living alongside the people of the river Suzanne was gifted

knowledge from local Maori which she was able to make into medicines. These medicines were advertised in newspapers in metropolitan areas and a market developed for the remedies she produced from local plants. So successful was she that big companies were interested in acquiring recipes and copying formulae. This exploitation prompted Suzanne to throw all her notes and writing into the river. She believed that the knowledge



should be kept sacred to the people of the river and not commercialised.
