THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS for 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, 3 July:

1. Isaiah 66:10-14 2. Galatians 6:14-18 Gospel: Luke 10:1-12,17-20 Needed: More Than 12

The first reading today gives a vivid image of God as Mother. With so many images of a masculine God throughout the Old and New Testaments, it is important not to pass over this one. Isaiah is proclaiming God's words of comfort to the Jews who have just returned to Jerusalem from exile in Babylon. Jerusalem is portrayed as a nursing mother, and that image is then assigned to God who will comfort, feed, and delight in Her children in the same way that a mother delights in her nursling. Because this reading is seemingly unrelated to the Gospel of the day, it often gets overlooked. You would do well to call it to others' attention.

Reflections on the Readings:

Twice in the Gospel of Luke Jesus sends disciples out to spread his mission by curing the sick and preaching the Kingdom of God, a realm of peace, justice, and compassion for all. The first time, in the chapter before this reading, Jesus sent out his 12 apostles. In the passage today, he sends out a larger group of 72 others. It seems Jesus realizes that he needs more than 12 helpers in this work! It's likely that this larger group of 72 included women as well as men. In chapter 8, Luke mentions by name several women who accompanied Jesus in his ministry throughout the cities and villages of Galilee, including Mary Magdalen, Joanna, and Susanna, "and many others, who provided for them out of their resources" (Lk 8:2-3). When Jesus sends out the 72, they are sent out in pairs. In the Acts of the Apostles and Paul's letters, there are references to married couples who work and travel together as missionaries. All of these references suggest Jesus didn't limit his calling to men only. Jesus instructions were practical for missionaries of his day when the early Christians relied on the hospitality and generosity of others who wanted to hear about Jesus' teachings. He did not want them slowed down by hauling their material possessions, and he challenged them to stretch themselves to trust in God's care for them provided through others. He also gave them advice about what to do when they were not received well, the proverbial "shake the dust from your feet" which Jesus demonstrated in last week's reading.

Although we may not be full-time Christian missionaries today, all of Jesus' instructions for how to conduct ourselves in our daily lives can still be relevant and offer guidance for our work and personal relationships. Questions:

Does it change how you think of this passage if you imagine Jesus sending out both women and men as "laborers for the harvest"? How so?

What might you be invited to let go of to lighten your load and free you up for easier movement in your life's work right now?

Where/when have you offered your skills, gifts, or time, only to have them rejected?

What was it like to try to shake the dust from your feet and move on?
